PREPARATION

The EU Online Conference was organised by all partners with Network for Children's Rights to have the lead. All partners were responsible to suggest young people for the organising committee. There were a number of meetings with young people in order to discuss the topics, speakers, their involvement and the date- time based on their availability. In the first contacts/ meetings there were 14-16 young people who were interested and presented their ideas; Topics should be on equality focusing on LGBTQI+, refugee issue and the EU identity-EU exchange programs for the youth. A shared document and excel were created in order the team to add questions, panellists etc. The team was limited in 6-7 people, who working in teams, finalised the topics and questions. Following the topics, there was a list of guest speakers and moderators. Some of the young people overtook the role of moderate and one of guest speaker. The moderator of the conference was a young girl from Greece while 2 young people from Bulgaria were the moderators for the panel on Opportunities in EU & 2 young people from Cyprus for the other two panels. The moderators decided on the type of discussion; questions- answer or presentations.

As the panels were finalised (guests, questions and moderators) a common email with instructions and the questions were sent to the guest speakers and moderators, to introduce each other. Close to the date of the event, we had meetings with the moderators in order to finalise the agenda, time limit, chat etc.

The meetings took place online on 26/4, 14/5, 23/5, 27/5, 30/5, 4/6, 7/6

The invitation and the agenda along with the registration link was posted in the project's website, partners' websites and social media. Also it was sent as newsletter and at the emailing lists of the partners. After registering, the attendees received an automatic confirmation email containing the joining webinar link and the agenda while there were 2 reminder emails one day & one hour before the event. The day before and same day we shared the join link in social media.

PARTICIPATION

The Conference was a great success and fruitful for the participants and the guests. The Conference took place in zoom webinar which is like virtual auditorium, ideal for events that are open to the public. The participants are divided into panellists and attendees, with separate links to join the webinar. Webinar attendees do not interact with one another, cannot turn on their camera but they can request to turn on the microphone and chat. By zoom webinar, only the panellists were on the screen and had access to all options ie share screen. In addition, the webinar license can host more attendees than the zoom meeting.

The conference lasted 3 hours; based on the zoom report there were 228 unique viewers, 594 total viewers while there were 175 concurrent viewers and 417 registrations in the form (not including the panellists and coordinators who were 19).

By default, the zoom report in unique viewers counts only computer and not smart devices, like smartphones & multiple devices using the same link; in our case many attendees joined through their phone and also as the partners shared the links, there were people using the same link (which was personalized). The attendees did not have permission to rename themselves so it was not possible to have the correct data.

Therefore, the people who joined through phone and used the same link (and appeared as one attendee) are not included in the unique viewers' number. Based on the join and leave time, the participants were 303(including attendees, panellists & coordinators).

The attendees came from 13 countries; the partner countries Bulgaria, Greece, Romania, Italy, Spain, Denmark, Cyprus, and from Belgium, USA, Turkey, Ireland, Netherlands & Bolivia. The disaggregation by country is by counting the name of the country. In addition, by the platform there is no data on gender disaggregation. We can only estimate (some by name).

The attendees were active and engaged in chat while 2 requested to comment on the panel for the Future of Refugees in EU.
